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2019 Accomplishments

84 students received academic tutoring and mentoring through Madison Team Success at Madison High and Middle Schools. Graduation rates have increased and more students registered for college.

26% of the graduating class of 2019 were assisted by our program.

15 volunteers donated 250+ hours to help students.

119 incoming 6th graders participated in **Jump Start** program orienting them to their new school, Madison Middle School.

152 3rd, 4th & 5th grade students at all of the Madison County elementary schools learned math skills through the **Great Leaps** program.
