Over 100 new 6<sup>th</sup> graders have the chance to learn about their new school through Jump Start.

#### **Madison High School**

- EMYS trains volunteers to provide one-on-one tutoring and mentoring for struggling students.
- Students receive assistance in meeting all requirements for graduation.

#### **Madison Middle School**

- 6<sup>th</sup> graders are introduced to their new school through Jump Start.
- Students receive tutoring and mentoring to help them succeed in school.

#### **2018 Accomplishments**

63 students received academic tutoring and mentoring through Madison Team Success at Madison High and Middle Schools. Graduation rates have increased and more students registered for college.

30% of the graduating class of 2018 were assisted by our program.

8 volunteers donated 250+ hours to help students.

135 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> grade students at all of the Madison elementary schools learned math skills through the Great Leaps program.

115 in-coming 6<sup>th</sup> graders participated in Jump Start program orienting them to their new school, Madison Middle School.

EMYS partners with many agencies and organizations, including Madison County School Board, Mars Hill University, the Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC), Rotary Club of Madison County, and the Madison County Health Department.
